Call to Order

NEW BUSINESS

Local Scholarship – Anson Amberson

Amber wants to start a scholarship for students to Tomah and Monroe county areas, to get PPL or start an aviation career. It would be for people in the Tomah are surrounding area. The scholarship would be a perpetual memorial in father's name, to promote aviation in Tomah and Monroe county area.

Anson gave a history of himself and his father. Among the things he mentioned was that his father helped start Chapter 1365.

He says a scholarship fund is needed to reinvigorate interest in aviation in the Tomah area. EAA would manage the fund, but EAA would sift thru applicants and come up the final selection. The minimum needed is \$10,000. They currently have \$2000. He has a target of 1 million. It would be for four separate students going to college, or break up for camperships, and then direct flight training. The more we could raise, the more benefit there could be.

Who would benefit – age 12 to 19 young people from Tomah, New Lisbon, Mauston. Maybe a 2nd tier would be Monroe County, 3rd tier – the rest of WI, 4th tier – rest of US.

There will be direct solicitations as well. Tomah School District will be part of the support. If they have an event such as a 4k run, would we be interested in coming and helping with parking or some other way.

The fundraising will come first, then brainstorming ways to promote aviation.

So they landed with a quartering tail wind. They were disappointed that they didn't check that, even though others were landing in the same direction.
