Technical and Safety Report

Technical: Sunset strip is a new product Dave tried for stripping, using an airless paint sprayer. He just sprayed it and the paint fell on the floor very easily.

Another time the cirrus was doing a procedural turn and it seemed to him that it was doing anything but what it should.

Bill was scud running at 500 ft, climbed at standard rate of turn, and he went inverted. He pushed forward on the yoke and it stabilized. Then he figured out he was upside-down.

When Tim S was in the military, he had a friend who was a helicopter pilot. He rode between the pilots one time. His friend had him close his eyes, and put your head up, down, right and left repeatedly. The pilot put it in a sharp left turn and then Tim opened his eyes and he thought he was climbing.

Heath is the new CFII giving flight instruction with Vonda. He came into the meeting by zoom and we all introduced ourselves. Heath is from Sparta. He's been flying since 2010. He started out with model airplanes, went to RCs, and now a CFII.
